GENERAL INFORMATION

Location of All Classes:

The learning mode for Summer School 2023 will be teacher-led in-person at Grant Community High School. Students enrolling in Summer School Driver's Education Classroom should be prepared to be on campus, in-person, and fully participate for the entire duration of courses.

Credit:

Driver Education is offered with no academic credit.

Enrollment:

Open to all students who reside within the District 124 attendance boundaries and who have passed at least 8 academic classes the prior two semesters in a high school. Students must be 15 years of age on or before the first class. Students who reside within the attendance boundaries, but do not attend Grant High School, must establish proof of residency at the time of registration.

Transportation:

Bus transportation is **not** provided.

Refunds:

Students who wish to withdraw prior to the first class meeting will be eligible for a tuition refund. Students who withdraw or who are dismissed during or after the first class meeting will not be eligible for a refund.

Medications:

If it is necessary for your child to take medication at school, the **Medication Information Form** can be downloaded and printed for submission (under the Student Services link of our main web page) or it can be picked up at the school. Inhalers may be a very important part of your child's daily needs. If necessary, once the Medication Information Form is completed by the physician and filed in the Nurse's office, your child will be authorized to carry his/her inhaler. Please have any medication labeled with medication name, dosage, expiration date, and student name. Medication must be in original container. Excluding the inhaler, all medication must be labeled and housed in the Nurse's office.

Registration/Payment

Dates of Registration:

January 5 – until full (waitlist will be available)

Tuition:

Driver Education - \$250

A **separate** \$20.00 check payment is required for a permit.

The teacher will provide more information on the first day of class.

DRIVER EDUCATION REQUIREMENTS

Summer school Driver Education is open to students who live within the Grant High School boundaries. **The following criteria must be met:**

- Students must be 15 years of age on or before the first class.
 - Students must have passed a minimum of 8 academic high school classes during the 2022-2023 school year.
 - Students must meet strict attendance rules in order to meet the State of Illinois requirements.
 - Students who miss more than ONE (1) day during a given session will be dismissed from summer school and receive a failing grade for that session.
 - Students who are in driver education are bound by all other rules of our attendance policy.
- Students who do not regularly attend Grant High School must have a transcript or signed affidavit from their home school counselor to verify having passed 8 classes during the 2022-2023 school year. **Students will not be allowed to begin class if this verification is not received by the first day of class.**

ATTENDANCE POLICY

All students are expected to be in attendance every day that summer school is in session. If a student cannot be in attendance on a specific day, the parent must notify the attendance office at 847-587-2266 no later than 8:15 A.M.

****ATTENDANCE IS MANDATORY THE LAST DAY OF EACH SEMESTER—NO EXCEPTIONS—PLEASE PLAN ACCORDINGLY****

The following summer school attendance rules will be enforced:

- Students will only be excused for illness (may require doctor verification), a family emergency, or a religious holiday.
- Students who miss more than two (2) days during a given session will be dismissed from summer school and receive a failing grade for that class.
- Tardiness to class counts as a partial absence.
- Three tardy arrivals will equal one day of absence.
- Students will be considered absent for a full day if they miss more than 15 minutes of class.
- Students will be considered absent for a full day if they leave school at any time before being dismissed.

Students may not leave the school grounds for any reason from 8:00 A.M. until dismissal at the end of the day.

STUDENT DISCIPLINE CODE

Discipline problems will not be tolerated during summer school. Students are expected to follow the instructions of their teachers and school administrators. If a student violates the Grant student discipline code, the following consequences may result:

1. The student may be sent home for the remainder of the day.
2. The student may be suspended for a specified number of days.
3. The student may be withdrawn from the summer school session and not receive credit.
4. Appropriate dress is required during summer school.

On the first day of each semester, an outline of academics, attendance, and behavioral expectations for all summer school students will be discussed and/or distributed.
