GENERAL INFORMATION

Mode of Learning:

The learning mode for Summer School Enrichment 2023 is dependent on course enrollment: some classes are teacher-led and in-person and other courses are online computer-based with teacher support. Placement determinations will be made by School Counselors at the time of enrollment.

Course Type:

Credit Recovery - Only students who have previously failed a course, received an NG (no grade), OR received an incomplete grade may register for the semester course that they failed, received a NG (no grade) or received an incomplete grade for.

Credit:

Each course taken and successfully completed will earn .5 credit. Multiple credits may be recovered/incomplete courses may be completed during Online Summer School. Any student enrolled in a course not completed by July 20, 2023 will have the opportunity to continue in a credit recovery class in a subsequent semester.

Enrollment:

Open to all students who reside within the District 124 attendance boundaries and who have completed their Freshman, Sophomore or Junior year. Students who reside within the attendance boundaries, but do not attend Grant High School, must establish proof of residency at the time of registration.

Transportation:

Bus transportation is **not** provided.

Fees:

There is no charge for credit recovery courses.

To sign up for credit recovery courses, enroll via Revtrak to request a seat. Counselor approval is required for Credit Recovery enrollment. After Revtrak requests are submitted, School Counselors will contact families to enroll in specific courses.

Medications:

If it is necessary for your child to take medication at school, the **Medication Information Form** can be downloaded and printed for submission (under the Student Services link of our main web page) or it can be picked up at the school. Inhalers may be a very important part of your child's daily needs. If necessary, once the Medication Information Form is completed by the physician and filed in the Nurse's office, your child will be authorized to carry his/her inhaler. Please have any medication labeled with medication name, dosage, expiration date, and student name. Medication must be in the original container. Excluding the inhaler, all medication must be labeled and housed in the Nurse's office.

TEACHER-LED COURSES

Students have the opportunity to recover up to one credit for previously failed or incomplete core classes. Classes will be instructed in a traditionally-taught teacher-led environment, in person format at Grant. Grades for these classes are pass/fail.

Students recovering failed credits in Health, ComCon, or P.E. from coursework will be enrolled in an Enrichment Course.

ONLINE COURSES

Students have the opportunity to recover multiple credits for previously failed or incomplete classes. Classes will be teacher-monitored online and computer instructed via Edgenuity. Grades for these courses are pass/fail. Edgenuity teachers will be onsite at Grant, and students enrolled in Edgenuity courses are expected to attend in person, unless individual accommodations are made. The online credit recovery option is ideal for students who are recovering multiple credits or have been previously successful learning using the Edgenuity platform.

Students recovering failed credits in Health, ComCon, or P.E. from coursework will be enrolled in an Enrichment Course.

ATTENDANCE POLICY

All students are expected to be in attendance every day that summer school is in session. If a student cannot be in attendance on a specific day, the parent must notify the attendance office at 847-587-2266 no later than 8:15 A.M.

****ATTENDANCE IS MANDATORY THE LAST DAY OF EACH SEMESTER—NO EXCEPTIONS—PLEASE PLAN ACCORDINGLY****

The following summer school attendance rules will be enforced:

- Students will only be excused for illness (may require doctor verification), a family emergency, or a religious holiday.
- Students who miss more than two (2) days during a given session will be dismissed from summer school and receive a failing grade for that class.
- Tardiness to class counts as a partial absence.
- Three tardy arrivals will equal one day of absence.
- Students will be considered absent for a full day if they miss more than 15 minutes of class.
- Students will be considered absent for a full day if they leave school at any time before being dismissed.

Students may not leave the school grounds for any reason from 8:00 A.M. until dismissal at the end of the day.

STUDENT DISCIPLINE CODE

Discipline problems will not be tolerated during summer school. Students are expected to follow the instructions of their teachers and school administrators. If a student violates the Grant student discipline code, the following consequences may result:

1. The student may be sent home for the remainder of the day.
2. The student may be suspended for a specified number of days.
3. The student may be withdrawn from the summer school session and not receive credit.
4. Appropriate dress is required during summer school.

On the first day of each semester, an outline of academics, attendance, and behavioral expectations for all summer school students will be discussed and/or distributed.
